RESEARCH PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The "Demographic Transitions, Economic Transitions" (TDTE) Chair is a forum for research and debate on the impact of ageing and longevity on France's economy and society. It was founded in 2008 on the initiative of Jean-Hervé Lorenzi, the holder of the TDTE Chair. It believes that the impact of longevity on our economic and social policies will be profoundly altered. Demographic changes and their impact on the economy mean that we need to develop not only our pension and social protection systems, but also our ambitions in terms of training and employment for all age groups, especially young people and senior citizens.

The TDTE Chair deals with the economic issues linked to demographic transition through three areas of study encompassing the multi-dimensionality of the Ageing Society. For each of these areas, it mobilises its resources, partners and associate researchers to produce research papers, reports and conferences, and to put forward proposals for action. The aim of the Chair's programme is to develop new economic and social policies within the conceptual framework of the Ageing Society. It is structured around 3 lines of research:

- Area 1: Modelling a sustainable ageing society
- Area 2: Proposing policies for the elderly
- Area 3: Building a society of intergenerational cohesion
